




Three fatal traffic accidents within a few hours

CURRENT SITUATION IN MALTA

- suspicion
- Low number of tests 173 in 2024, with high positivity rate
- Testing for alcohol on reasonable
 Selective enforcement vs systematic prevention
 - Draft legislation for random alcohol and drug testing
 - Public debate: deterrence vs personal freedom

RECENT HEADLINES

85 road blocks in one week has resulted in 220 drivers being fined, including five who were drunk

September 1, 2025



Appeal court overturns drunk driving conviction due to faulty breathalyser







Random roadside drug and alcohol testing to come into effect



WHY IT MATTERS: PUBLIC HEALTH PERSPECTIVE

DUI is a global epidemic – 1 in 4 road deaths involve alcohol
 Even low BAC (0.05%) doubles crash risk
 Alcohol contributing factor in 25-30% of crashes It is not just alcohol which causes impairment – drugs both recreational and medicinal
 Drugs contributing factor in 15-20% of crashes
 High-risk groups: young male drivers, night-time driving

BUILDING AWARENESS AND SKILLS

- •Tailored campaigns for youths, families, professional drivers.
- •Teach practical prevention by planning safe rides, intervening safely.
 - •Empowerment through education and community partnerships.



EFFECTIVE INTERVENTIONS

- Random Breath Testing (RBT) proven effective internationally
 - Lower BAC limits save lives
- Visible enforcement deters offenders more than harsh penalties



LESSONS FROM OTHER COUNTRIES

•Australia: 36% reduction in crashes after RBT introduction

•Scotland: Lower BAC improved public attitudes

•Sweden: Enforcement + rehabilitation = long-term results



WHAT MALTA NEEDS

- Expand RBT to high-risk localities
 Drug testing and enforcement
- Ensure calibration and officer training
 - Publish enforcement data quarterly
- Promote consistent, fair, data-driven enforcement

STRENGTHENING SUPPORT SYSTEMS

Low testing and forensic capacity

•Few structured rehabilitation options

Limited victim support services



FIXING THE GAPS

- Mandatory Health Assessment for DUI offenders
 - Calibration and Training for all equipment
- Integrated referral pathway and rehabilitation
- Victim support and late-night transport options

INTERSECTORAL COLLABORATION

•Shared responsibility: health, police, transport, education, media, NGOs
•Quarterly data monitoring and transparent reporting

MAIN MESSAGE

•Every crash headline represents a preventable loss

•We have the evidence, tools, and power to act

·Let's move from outrage to prevention, from reaction to collaboration



SUBSTANCE ABUSE IN THE WORKPLACE

- Growing concern Rising use of alcohol, prescription & illicit substances
- Impaired performance Slower reaction, poor judgment, reduced alertness
- Ripple effect Risks extend beyond work, including driving after shifts
- Warning signs Mood swings, lateness, unexplained absences, declining output
- Employer role Focus on prevention, support, and rehabilitation
- Policy alignment Integrate workplace substance policies with road safety and occupational health
- Impairment doesn't stop at the workplace its effects follow onto our roads.
